Mission to Seafarers Africa has a presence in the following countries: Kenya, Namibia South Africa, Nigeria and, Reunion Island We have a presence in the ports of Mombasa, Richards Bay, Durban, Port Elizabeth/Koega, Saldanha Bay, Cape Town, Walvis Bay and Lagos,

The work in these ports is carried out by Port Chaplains and Ship Visitors with the support and assistance of Management Committees. At present we support the work in two ecumenical centers namely Durban and Reunion Island. There is a MTS center in Lagos and Mombasa and we have just opened a drop-in center in Saldanha Bay
